

Keeping our shopping strips clean

An innovative Council service is helping to improve the appearance of our local strip shopping centres.

The service, which is known as Clean City Patrol, involves patrolling strip shopping centres to ensure cleanliness and safety.

Regular cleaning operations are undertaken in the early hours of the day to ensure minimum interruption to traders and traffic.

However, as Council's street cleansing operations in strip shopping centres are a pre-dawn activity, the service largely

goes unseen and unrecognised, though it has been successful.

The Clean City Patrol initiative ensures that we keep the unique character of our six main strip shopping centres vibrant and attractive, while attending to incidents of mess and reducing any unsightly appearance.

The service involves a Council contractor monitoring each of Council's six major strip shopping centres three to four times daily.
